Barnyard hands were undefeated on the basketball courts.




Village Superintendent had trouble with calendars, weather reports, ice and snow. . . Youngin's went home to slide and ski down snowy pasture hills.

For the vegetarian: Barley, beans, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, peppers and spinach can be planted this month.




Farmyard fillies training time... to select those who will cheer next year's barnyard boys on.
