
# MISS HELENE MILLETT


Examination time came much too soon

That joy which springs from being safe and free.




There wasn't much excitement through the year,

At Pittsfield High, our air raid drills began;


And many teachers joined a first aid class; The Household Arts girls sewed on children's clothes

And slowly we began to understand That every little sacrifice we made Was going to help America win the war.



thoughts.





In May, the sugar rationing began,

Joined First Aid classes that were being held.





### Foundations for Peace

(Maplewood Prize Essay)

#### WRITTEN BY HELEN SUHINSKI

Peace is not an end in itself. It is a condition for the realization of a world of social and economic justice and of human freedom. The history of the world has been one of struggles, struggles to keep open the door to this kind of peace. Men have yearned, killed, and died for it. Yet, whenever it was won, they did nothing to keep it, and its misuse led to the necessity of repeating the bloody process. These struggles brought the world nothing but disaster and ruin. The future will not be brighter unless man starts planning now, planning to shut the door to war and lay the firm foundations of a just, durable, and charitable peace. Peace cannot be preserved by putting the future in a strait jacket, but only by seeking to control, change, and direct it. It is the result of positive, creative, and constructive policy.

The plans for the organization of peace must draw upon past experience. We should plan for a world of freedom, social justice, economic and political security; a world in which human intelligence will organize and distribute the ample resources of nature so that all can live abundantly; a world in which intelligence will be devoted to human progress rather than to destruction; a world in which man's labor may be directed toward his own advancement. We must extend unalienable rights to all men. The right to live, not just exist, should be denied to none. It should be a just peace, because nothing permanent can be built on hate and violence. The peace plans should measure up to the Wilsonian ideal: "A justice that plays no favorites and knows no standard but the equal rights of the several peoples concerned." There cannot be any trustworthy security except by giving the decent elements in a people a chance to cooperate in the work of peace. No nation can be punished as a whole and at the same time leave any hope of lasting peace. These peace plans should be made now while there is still time to think out the problems of lasting peace. When hostilities cease, there is a cry for haste, and men's hearts are filled with hate and revenge.

The United States must have the largest share in the peace making, because it is the strongest power in the world. No international system is possible without its cooperation. If it withdraws from the execution of the peace plans, this peace, too, will fail. The United States will carry the greatest burden after the war. What the American people want is a world in which they can live and enjoy lasting peace. Cooperation that will make this posssible is the price we are asking in return for canceling the material obligations that will be due when victory has been won.

Representative government is the best foundation of hope for a lasting peace. It generally breeds peaceable aims. Fostering it should play a large part in the


better organization of the conquered countries that will be restored to independence. Representative government should be used as an incentive to the people of the Axis powers to abandon their old ways and become peaceful nations. We cannot force the idea of representative government on them, because the lasting acceptance of any governing idea lies in the intellectual processes of races. We should strive to at least have them accept the principles, and then nurture it for long years to come.

Peace can only start when a group of nations cares enough about it to be willing to wage war against a violator of international law. All the blunders committed by the democratic governments during the past two fatal decades were justified on the ground that peace was what we wanted above all, and that only by accepting the aggressions of others could the democracies preserve this precious peace. We must institute the legal use of force by a central authority. Postwar planners are convinced that the only way to maintain peace permanently is to be prepared to enforce it, and their bold intention is to prevent any future Hitler-led nations from becoming strong enough to start another such war. Any scheme which suggests solving the problem of peace without the legal use of force in international affairs is utopian. It has never worked, and it never will work. Peace is law. Law is the justified use of force. Consequently, peace without the employment of force is inconceivable. In any kind of planning for the future, on whatever basis we want to organize the relationship among peoples, the condition of success is the recognition of force as an indispensable reality.

The joint will of nations, their vigorous cooperation, the generosity of large countries whose very strength obliges them to be the most just, the aspiration of weak countries to strengthen themselves, not in the material sense, not by territorial expansion, but by their intellectual and moral improvement, the faith of all in justice, mutual confidence and mutual respect—these are the foundations of a peace without balances of power.

Peace is what man makes it. Plans alone cannot assure lasting peace. The things that make for success, the willingness of people to fill their obligations, sound, enlightened public opinion, the honest effort of men to study the peace problems and find solutions for them, have as great a bearing on lasting peace as the plans. Intelligent public interest must prepare the way. Machinery should be set up to provide for international cooperation to preserve peace. The plans of religious leaders to spiritualize the inner man are essential to any peace. If man finds the inspiration to strive for peace, he works more diligently for it.

Here is the chance to bind the wounds, to restore faith, to bring new hope to the world, and to make peace on earth, good will toward men a reality. Can we meet the challenge? We must!

With the dimming of the lights and the staccato taps of Mr. Gorman's able baton, the overture began, weaving hints of the unforgettable Gilbert and Sullivan melodies which were later enlarged upon in the course of the

performance.

The leading characters gave spirited portrayals in their individual roles. Francis Molloy—as the gay and gallant Colonel Fairfax, and Evelyn Tainter—as the beauteous Elsie Maynard, gave a charming presentation of the romantic interest. Florence Gomes was excellent as the clever Phoebe, while Frank Barrecca, as Jack Point, danced and sang his role of the jester with commendable ease and skill. Richard Carpenter as Wilfred, and Douglas Butler as the Lieutenant presented their roles with fine realism. William Milton III, playing dual roles of Leonard Merryl and the First Yeoman, handled both with agility. As the forceful Dame Carruthers, Phyllis Cooley gave a vivid interpretation of the more-than-willing female pursuing the reluctant Sergeant Merryl, a part well handled by Carl Proper. Earl Proper—as the Second Yeoman, and Patricia Smith as Kate, in spite of small parts, made a distinct contribution to the evening's enjoyment. The part of the dauntless headsman was realistically portrayed by Norman Bornak.

The combined choruses did a splendid job, both on their own and as a melodious background for the leading characters, while the orchestra of chosen players from the school's orchestra played the difficult music with ease. All these factors, augmented by the competence of John Evans, General Chairman; Delight Bullock and William Magner, Co-chairmen of tickets; Margaret Maloney, chairman of programs; Priscilla Musgrove and Russell Bousquet, chairmen of ushers and doormen; Donald Gilbert, stage chairman; Edward George, publicity chairman; and their energetic committees;—all these contributed to the success of the "Yeomen."

Thanks must go to Mr. Gorman, who gave us an opera of which we may be proud. In the words of all who participated, "We wish we could give it again!"


# Physical Fitness for Nephews of Uncle Sam




