After years of evading the law's demands,

The subjects they studied were straight from the classics;
E.g., rhetoric, Greek, and Euclidean mathematics.
Philosophy, mental and moral, was asked;
And with bookkeeping also the students were tasked.
The school grew in numbers, but not in capacity;
So to deal with the great intellectual voracity
"Twas rebuilt.

Grade school and high school were therein combined.
Soon enrollment surpassed that for which 'twas designed.
When the powers deemed it well to reward lucubration

But a new one was built in a very short time

For a new school.



school



That P. H. S. is nifty!








DON MOREHEAD, *Captain*




