But oddly enough, even though touched by this cynicism, we remain children in a sense. We also share a common hope that perhaps we have been given a chance to make our world a "better place." Surely, the road has been paved for us through time; but never before has a spirit so enveloped a generation that it can be felt from Tokyo to Chicago to Prague. We only differ in our methods of attaining this "betterment."

As one popular song has it, "you've got to start it individually." Understanding of other men can only be based on accepting their equality with yourself and respecting their rights as you value your own. These are words that are usually associated with idealistic youth; adults have outgrown them, perhaps rightfully so, because, though lovely, they are impractical and, pessimistically viewed, unreachable.

Brotherhood is probably the most popular of these intangibles in our time. From it flows the best of man's nature - love and peace; but brotherhood is also one of those Utopian concepts. It is unfortunately inherent to man's nature that he can ever attain perfection. There will never exist a world where man can dwell with man without greed or war or hate. Yet, we must not adopt an "all or nothing" philosophy. We must use that perfection as a goal. We must go forth to seek Tennyson's "newer world", conscious of the fact that we will probably never reach it, but with the hope that we may come close. It is in this spirit that we, the class of 1969, dedicate our yearbook, and ourselves, to BROTHERHOOD.
